



## Collectively Protected Field Hospital CPFH

### Description

Collectively Protected Field Hospital (CPFH) provides a capability to sustain medical treatment in a Chemical, Biological, and Radiological (CBR) contaminated environment through collective protection systems. There are three variants: US Army's Deployable Medical Systems (DEPMEDS), US Air Force's Expeditionary Medical Support (EMEDS), and US Navy's Expeditionary Medical Facility (EMF).



### Mission

Design, develop, test, procure, field and provide life cycle oversight of Collective Protection systems for US Army, US Air Force, and US Navy Field Hospitals that provide contamination free areas to protect personnel and equipment against CBR threats.

### Capabilities

- Expeditionary Collective Protection
- Deployable in various modular configurations
- Allows for entry and exit of decontaminated patients
- Perform mission critical tasks in a Toxic Free Area without individual protective equipment
- Protect air and water supplies
- Allows sustained hospital operations in CBR environment for a 72-hour period
